FREE TUITION!

Beginning Fall 2024, eligible graduates of the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD), CMSD partner charter schools, and the East Cleveland City School District who are admitted to Case Western Reserve University will receive financial support to cover the full cost of attendance.

To be eligible, students must have attended a CMSD school (or partner charter school) or an East Cleveland public school for their final two years of high school.

This includes tuition, on-campus housing, supplies, books and personal expenses. Students also will receive mentored, paid research or internship experience on campus.


